

Dear Parents and Carers,

New Attendance policy

From September 2015 The Government will be changing the rate at which they determine when a child is considered a 'Persistently Absent Child'. The present rate is 85% attendance or below. From September this threshold rate will increase to 90% or less. This means that if your child has a unauthorised absence of more than 14 sessions (7days) in Term one then they will appear on our Persistent Absence Report. This report is then forwarded to the Education Welfare Team for monitoring purposes.
