

The children played war time games, ate food that would have been eaten during the war and took part in a talk by Mr Stack who was born during the war and was able to share first-hand experiences of what life was like during that period. The children also stayed over; sleeping in various places around the school and woke up this morning to an air raid warning which sent them scurrying off to the air raid shelter. I would like to thank the members of the Year 5 and 6 staff for staying over and making this a really worthwhile and memorable learning experience for the pupils.
